

Michael F. Doyle founded Acheson Doyle Partners Architects (ADP) with David C. Acheson in 1985. Since the firm's inception, he has led the development of a significant practice in historic preservation and rehabilitation projects, ecclesiastical projects, assisted living facilities, hotels, schools, residential, and real estate consulting including master planning and zoning analyses. As a Principal of the firm, Michael is responsible for the management of the company and oversees all phases of a project, from conceptual design through construction administration.

Notable projects directed by Michael include the design of a new rooftop dining lounge, guest rooms renovation and fitness center expansion for The Metropolitan Club—a McKim, Mead and White landmark in New York City, Club Quarters hotels in New York City and Boston, and historic preservation and rehabilitation work spanning 20 years for the Basilica of Old St. Patrick's Cathedral complex in New York City. Other significant projects include the renovation of several buildings at the historic College of Mt. Saint Vincent in New York City, the renovation and expansion of offices for the Carnegie Council on Ethics in New York City, the design of a new convent in Caldwell, New Jersey, master planning for Loyola University in Abuja, Nigeria and zoning work for New York City's Museum of Modern Art. He leads all of the firm's work for the Archdiocese of New York and the Diocese of Brooklyn, and for prominent real estate developers such as Vornado, Macklowe Properties, Tishman Speyer and HFZ.

Michael was a Design Fellow at the National Endowment for the Arts in Washington, DC. He has taught architectural history as a Teaching Fellow at Harvard University, and he has served on architectural juries at Columbia, Harvard, and Drexel schools of architecture. The Church of St. Brigid-St. Emeric, for which Michael provided oversight, was awarded the Lucy G. Moses award by the Landmarks Conservancy in 2014. He is currently Chairman of the Kathmandu Valley Preservation Trust and is consulting on urban design and conservation in Patan, Nepal with UNESCO and the Nepalese government.
